## Health Rules for Dairy Cattle General Regulations for Dairy Cattle

### Judging:

All animals in a CLASS will be judged together.

An Animal in a Class will NOT be able to win more than ONE PLACE

Exhibitors of livestock must inform themselves as to when their stock will be judged. Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out to competing.

### Superintendent:

May call upon current membership,

All Classes will be held together and conducted on time.

### Exhibitor:

Exhibitors are limited to show not more than 2 animals in each class of the Seven Dairy Breeds listed.

The exhibitors will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all their equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.

Exhibitors will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent; to accept the stall assigned without controversy; to keep their animals in an attractive appearance, cooperate with the Department to increase the educational value of the show.

Decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals at shows shall be prohibited until after the awards have been made in respective classes by the judges.

However, open classes, 4-H and FFA members and Youth under 19 must be present and have charge of their animals at the time of judging.

In addition to open classes, 4-H and FFA project animals and Youth under 19 will be judged for 4-H and FFA premiums. Must keep pens presentable during the week

Also, must clean pens after you take animals out of the pens. You were assigned failure will result from the exhibitor's being able to show at the Cookport Fair the following year.

Animals must be on the Fair Grounds no later than 3pm Monday.

Vehicles picking up livestock are not allowed inside fairgrounds until 9 pm (side gate) or 10 pm (main gate).
