Breeding Sheep

General regulations for Sheep

Judging:

- All animals in a CLASS will not be judged together
- An animal in a Class will NOT be able to win more than ONE PLACE when their stock will be judged.
- Stock must be in the ring promptly on call and failure to comply with the order renders exhibitors liable to be ruled out to competing.
- When on exhibition in the ring, each animal must be under halter and in charge of owner or owner's representative.
- Open Sheep Judging Monday at 6:30pm.

Superintendent:

Definitions:

- All classes will be held together and conducted on time.
- All show sheep must be individually identified by an ear tag.
- All lambs and sheep must be slick shorn within 10 days of show, unless breed states otherwise. This will be at the discretion of the Superintendent if it becomes a controversial matter.

The Exhibitor:

- Is limited to show no more than 2 animals in each class of the eighteen breeds listed
- Will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all their equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.
- Will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent, to accept the stall assigned without controversy, to keep their animals in an attractive appearance and to cooperate with the Department in every way that may be to increase the educational value of the show.
- Will not display decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals at other shows until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges.
- That has any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions must be removed from the fair grounds.
- Joint ownership considered being as one owner in accordance with registration papers.
- The same classifications and premium stated below are to apply to each of the following breeds:
- Sheep exhibitors will furnish dividers to separate rams from ewes.
- Animals must be on the Fair Grounds no later than 3pm Monday.
- Must keep pens presentable during the week.
- Also, must clean pens after you take animals out of the pen. You were assigned failure will result from the exhibitor's being able to show at the Cookport Fair the following year.
- Vehicles picking up livestock are not allowed inside fairgrounds until 9 pm (side gate) or the main gate (10 pm).

4-H & FFA must due the Department number 10 and may enter in open class Department number 04.

Youth 19 and under must use the Department number 11 and may enter in open class Department number 04.

General Regulations for Market Sheep

Judging

- All Animals in a CLASS will be judged together
- An animal in a class will NOT be able to win more than ONE PLACE
- Animals must be in the ring promptly at the time of call. Failure to comply may at the judge's discretion.
- When any class exceeds 15 entries, the class may be divided and premiums paid for the added class at the discretion of the Youth entering the show

Superintendent:

- Purebred classes must have identified their animals as purebreds.
- Minimum weight 65 pounds, maximum weight 145 pounds. Sheep weighing less than 60 pounds or more than 150 pounds will not be re-weighted.
- The weight of each animal will be announced
- Class weights will be determined after weighing in and be posted prior to the show.

The Exhibitor:

- That has any animal of unthrifty nature, unsuitable condition, or which cannot be satisfactorily handled under show conditions must be removed from the fair grounds.
- Will have sheep individually identified by an ear tag
- Will be expected to display or parade their animals as directed by the Superintendent.
- Is expected to accept the stall assigned without controversy will be expected to keep the space they occupy in a clean and sanitary condition and to remove all of their equipment promptly as the Superintendent may direct.
- Will not display decorations with ribbons or ornaments previously won by animals at other shows until after the awards have been made in their respective classes by the judges.
- Must have Market sheep on the grounds no later than 1pm through 5pm on Sunday prior to the fairs start date for weight in
- Is expected to keep their animals in an attractive appearance
- Is to cooperate with the Superintendent that will serve to increase the educational value of the show.
- 4-H & FFA & Youth 19 and under only
- Animals must be on the Fair Grounds no later than 3pm Monday
- Must keep pens presentable during the week
